USS Yosemite Reunion 2023

I hope this finds all of you in good health and spirits. Please take the time to look at our Website and notice some of its stories. Alphonso, our webmaster, has worked hard to keep it up to date, and it serves as a resource for the prior Yosemite crew members and their families to be reminded of a great ship the USS Yosemite was for 50 years and its service to our country.

I know some of you belong to other Associations, especially those that have been on Destroyers (Tin Cans), and like us, they often struggle to keep track of members and their current status. We have a distinct advantage with a crew of over a thousand at a time; wow, many people have served aboard the Yosemite since world war two.

Many of our crew in the Newport area migrated there after leaving the Ship. They serviced other ships in other regions of the North East with different homeports that they settled there after their discharge or retirement. Later in Yosemite's life, Mayport, Florida, became the dominant homeport. Jacksonville and the surrounding areas still have many of our Yosemite people.

I was an old fellow aboard the "Busy Lady" with over 22 years of service (91-93), but there were a lot of much younger sailors, some just beginning their Naval Service. Our strategy is to focus on the Jacksonville area to gain some of the later crews and, in many cases, younger people to keep our group going.

Our Reunions allow us to return to our past lives, relationships, and history. You will find the cycle is very much the same, no matter what timeframe you were on the Ship. You start doing a job that's part of the overall scope in the chain of command to protect our nation and its interests. Through the years, you continue the work at your job that may even change as new conflicts evolve around the world.
